Licensing Specialist Observed Through Surveillance Footage From the Incident. At Approximately 10:11am, the Video Showed Children Entering the Classroom for Nap Time. H.V. Is Seen Crawling Into the Room. K.M, Covering Him Entirely in a Blanket, Covering Him From Head to Toe. H.V. Attempted to Sit Up While Still Covered as K.M. Closes the Room Door. K.M. Bent Over to H.V. and Forcibly Pushed Him Backward Into a Lying Position, and Re-covered Him with the Blanket, Fully Wrapping Him Again. K.M Was Attempting to Get to Her Phone, She Approached K.C., Grabs His Legs, and Pulled Them Into a Prone Position Before Completely Covering the Child with a Blanket. H.V. Is Seen Moving Slightly but Does Not Uncover Himself and Appear to Remain in the Same Position. At This Point, K.M. Raised Her Finger at Another Child Before Forcibly Pushing K.C.
