Indoor Play Areas Must Be Inspected Daily for Basic Health and Safety and Documented on a Daily Inspection Log. Outdoor Play Areas Must Be Inspected Daily for Basic Health and Safety. Any Problems Must Be Corrected Before the Play Area Is Used by Children. Documentation of the Indoor Play Area Inspection Must Be Maintained for 12 Months. (1). The single finding was not critical.
