Across 6 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were Child/ren Were Placed in a Crib, Playpen, Play Yard or Other Sleeping and Napping Bedding with Items That Could Pose a Strangulation or Suffocation Risk. Specialist Observed That Children in Crib Were Covered with a Blanket and Had Bottles in Crib. Specialist Had Teachers Remove All Blankets and Bottles From Childrens Cribs. In the Childcare Facility Handbook on Page 26. Cribs or Playpens/play Yards Used for Infants Must Have Tight Fitted Sheets and No Excess Bedding, Which Includes but Is Not Limited To: Bumper Pads, Hanging Mobiles, Quilts, Comforters, Receiving Blankets, Pillows, Stuffed Animals and Cushions. Due Date Completed at Time of Inspection (1), Supervision of Children in the [3 Year Old Classroom] Group Was Inadequate in That [One Teacher in the Classroom Was Not Supervising the Children in Her Care.]. CCF Handbook, Section 2.4 General Requirements [SR]

Specialist Observed That One of the Teachers in the Classroom Was Not Supervising the Children While the Other Teacher Was Conducting Circle Time. Teacher Will Need to Take the DCF Training Online Class Titled Challenging Behaviors and Awareness (CBAP). Per the Childcare Facility Handbook on Page 12. General Supervision Requirements A. Childcare Personnel Must Position Themselves in the Outdoor Play Area So That All Children Can Be Observed and Directly Supervised. B. Childcare Personnel Must Be Assigned to Provide Direct Supervision to a Specific Group of Children and Be with That Group of Children at All Times. Due Date 3/13/2026 (1), and Bottles And/or Sippy Cups Brought From Home Were Not Labeled with Childs First and Last Name. CCF Handbook, Section 3.9.5, B Food and Nutrition [SR]

Specialist Observed That the Three-year-old Room and the Four-year-old/ VPK Room Did Not Have Water Bottles Labeled with Childs First and Last Name on Them. Specialist Had the Director Label the Water Bottles and Sippy Cups Brought From Home. Per Childcare Handbook on Page 35. Bottles and Sippy Cups Brought From Home Shall Be Individually Labeled with the Childs First and Last Name and Shall Be Returned to the Custodial Parent or Legal Guardian Daily. Due Date Completed at Time of Inspection SANITATION AND EQUIPMENT (1). None of the 13 findings were critical.

Specialist Observed That One of the Teachers in the Classroom Was Not Supervising the Children While the Other Teacher Was Conducting Circle Time. Teacher Will Need to Take the DCF Training Online Class Titled Challenging Behaviors and Awareness (CBAP). Per the Childcare Facility Handbook on Page 12. General Supervision Requirements A. Childcare Personnel Must Position Themselves in the Outdoor Play Area So That All Children Can Be Observed and Directly Supervised. B. Childcare Personnel Must Be Assigned to Provide Direct Supervision to a Specific Group of Children and Be with That Group of Children at All Times. Due Date 3/13/2026

If Awaiting Out-of-State Criminal History Results, a Copy of the DCF Email Informing of the Individuals Eligibility for a Provisional Hire Status Must Be in the Personnel File. One Childcare Employee Who Was Not in Compliance with Training Requirements When They Left the Industry in March of 2023, Did Not Complete Required Training Before Returning to the Industry. Director Stated She Has Finished All of the Courses, and She Will Complete the Testing Within the Next 30 Days. The Child Care Facility Handbook States: 4.3 Break in Service A. In the Event an Individual Leaves the Childcare Industry in Compliance with Training Requirements and Returns to the Industry Either at the Same or a Different Childcare Facility, He or She Will Be Given 90 Days to Comply with Any New Training Requirements Established During the Gap in Employment in the Childcare Industry. B. In the Event an Individual Leaves the Childcare Industry Not in Compliance with the Training Requirements and Returns to the Industry Either at the Same or a Different Childcare Facility, He or She Must Comply with the Training Requirements Described in This Section, as Well as Any New Training Requirements That May Have Been Added During the Gap in Employment in the Childcare Industry Prior to Re-employment.

A Room Had an Air Vent That Had Lint Build Up on the Vent. Staff Removed the Lint From the Air Vent. Director Stated They Would Change the Air Filters More Often to Stop the Accumulation of Lint and Dust. The Child Care Facility Handbook States: 3.1 General Health and Safety Requirements B. It Is the Responsibility of the Director/operator to Ensure All Areas and Equipment of the Facility Are Free From Fire Hazards, Such as Lint Build Up in Heating and Air Vents, Filters, Exhaust Fans, Ceiling Fans, and Dryer Vents. This Includes Grease Build-up in Ovens, Stoves and Food Equipment.

Chemical Sanitization Could Not Be Measured Accurately as the Incorrect Testing Strips Were Being Used. Counselor Left a Tube of Strips for This Facility to Use. C. Chemical Sanitization. 1. If Chemical Sanitization Is Used, an Exposure Time of at Least 7 Seconds Is Required for a Chlorine Solution of 50 mg/L That Has a pH of 10 or Less and a Temperature of at Least 75 Degrees Fahrenheit. 2. If Other Sanitizers Are Used, the Manufacturer Instructions Must Be Strictly Followed. 3. A Test Kit or Other Device That Accurately Measures the Concentration of the Sanitizing Solution Must Be Available and Used to Confirm Appropriate Concentration of Solution During Each Use.

If the Ground Cover in Place Is Loose Ground Cover (Such As, but Not Limited To: Mulch, Shredded Rubber Chips, or Sand) a Minimum of 6 Inches in Depth Is Required in the Use Zone. Asphalt, Concrete, Hard Packed Dirt, Hay, Grass or Leaves Are Unsuitable for Use in the Use Zone Area.

The Employer/owner/operator Must Review Each Employment Application to Assess the Relevancy of Any Issue Uncovered by the Complete Background Screening, Including Any Arrest, Pending Criminal Charge, or Conviction, and Must Use This Information in Employment Decisions in Accordance with State Laws. K. The Employer/owner/operator Must Add Child Care Personnel to Their Employee/Contractor Roster in the Clearinghouse Within 10 Days of When the Individual Has Received a Child Care Eligible Result and Has Been Hired at the Facility. Upon Review of the Fire Drill Log It Was Discovered That a Fire Drill Had Not Been Conducted Since February. A Drill Was Conducted Today with This Counselor During Nap Time. There Were 66 Children and 13 Staff Members Participating. The Child Care Facility Handbook States on Page 27: 3.8.4 Fire Drills A. During the Facility's License Year, Fire Drills Utilizing the Alarm System, Approved by the Local Fire Authority, Must Be Conducted Monthly at Various Dates and Times When Children Are in Care. C. A Current Attendance Record and Parent Contact Information Must Accompany Child Care Personnel Out of the Building During a Drill or Actual Evacuation and Be Used to Account for All Children. The Operator Must Maintain a Written Record of the Fire Drills Showing the Date, Number of Children and Child Care Personnel in Attendance, Evacuation Route Used, and Time Taken for All Individuals to Evacuate the Premises. Each Fire Drill Record Must Be Maintained for a Minimum of 12 Months From the Date of the Fire Drill. The Fire Drills Conducted Must Include, at a Minimum: 1.
