These Items, as Well as Knives, Sharp Tools, and Other Potentially Dangerous Hazards, Must Be Stored in a Locked Area or Must Be Inaccessible and Out of a Childs Reach at All Times. The Director of This Facility Has Terminated the Employee Who Was Found Doing This. The Childcare Facility Handbook States on Page 63: 8.2 Child Safety C. Child Care Personnel Must Appropriately Interact with Children to Foster a Healthy, Safe Environment That Will Encourage the Child's Physical, Intellectual, Motor, and Social Development. Interactions with Children That Are Aggressive, Demeaning or Intimidating in Nature Are Strictly Prohibited.
