In Groups of Mixed Age Ranges, Where Children One Year of Age but Under Two Years of Age Are Included, One Child Care Personnel Must Be Responsible for No More Than Six Children of Any Age Group, at All Times (1). This Timeframe Does Not Start Over if Personnel Change Employment to Another School Readiness Provider Within This Initial 90 Days. Personnel Who Have Not Completed All Preservice Training Requirements Are Not Allowed Any Unsupervised Contact with or Care of Children in a School Readiness Program

- **The Base of the Fence in the Outdoor Play Area Was Not at Ground Level and Could Allow Inside or Outside Access by Children or Animals. CCF Handbook, Section 3.5, F**

During the Playground Inspection of the Large Playground, Two Sides of the Fence Were Observed to Not Be at Ground Level. The Child Care Facility Handbook States on Page 24 That: F. The Outdoor Play Area Must Have Adequate Fencing or Walls a Minimum of 4 Feet in Height. Fencing, Including Gates, Must Be Continuous and Must Not Have Gaps or Opening Larger Than 3 Inches That Would Allow Children to Exit the Outdoor Play Area. The Base of the Fence Must Remain at Ground Level and Be Free From Erosion or Build Up to Prevent Inside and Outside Access by Children or Animals. These Areas Must Have at Least Two Exits, with at Least One Being Remote From the Buildings. If an Outdoor Play Area Was Approved for Usage by the Department Prior to October 25, 2017, No New Exits Are Required to Be Added to Meet This Standard. However, if Outdoor Play Area Fencing Is Changed Then the Standard Would Apply, and Two Exits Must Be Provided.
