Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were 290-2-3-.08(2) Requires the Home to Maintain a File for Each Child That Includes Evidence of Age-appropriate Immunizations or a Signed Affidavit Against Such Immunizations (2), 290-2-3-.07(9)(a) Requires That Every Calendar Year, After the First Year of Employment the Provider, Provisional Employees or and Employees, Shall Attend Ten (10) Clock Hours of Diverse Training Which Is Offered by an Accredited College, University or Vocational Program or Other Department-approved Source. It Was Determined Based on a Review of Records the Provider Had Five of 10 Required Trainin (1), and 290-2-3-.19(1)(b)1 Requires That Cots and Mats Shall Be of Sound Construction and of Sufficient Size to Accommodate Comfortably the Size and Weight of the Child. Mats Must Be in Good Repair, Washable, Covered with Waterproof Material and at Least Two Inches (2") Thick. It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Mat Used Were Not the Require Two Inches Thick. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
