It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Following Hazards Were Accessible to the Children: \* D-3R-2's Had Baby Wipes in the Children's Cubby Accessible to Children. \* A-1L-Prek Had Loos (1), Playground Observed to Be Clean on This Date. Finding 591-1-1-.26(9) Requires the Playground to Be Kept Clean, Free From Litter and Free of Hazards, Such as but Not Limited to Rocks, Exposed Tree Roots and Exposed Sharp Edges of Concrete. It Was Determined Based on Observation the Following Hazards Were Observed on the Playgrounds: Playground (3-12 YEARS) Had Chipped or Peeling Paint on the Play S (1), and Staff Were Observed to Remind Children to Wash Hands on This Date.
