Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were 290-2-3-.11(2)(f) Requires That Poisons, Medicines, Cleaning Agents and Other Hazardous Materials Be in Locked Areas or Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That There Were Adult Scissors and a Stapler on the Desk. and a Treadmill with the Cord on the Floor Is Center Space. Further, There Were Razors Stored in a Drawer in the Restroom.
