Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were 290-2-3-.13(1) Requires That the Home Be Clean and Free From Hazards. It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Carpet in the Left Side Classrooms Had the Edges of the Carpet Unraveling and Not Connected to the Floor Causing a Tripping Hazard. Also, the Bathroom Toilet Screws Were Missing and Needed Replacing.
