Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.26(6) Requires That Playground Equipment Provide an Opportunity for the Children to Engage in a Variety of Experiences and Shall Be Age-appropriate. For Example, Toddlers Shall Not Be Permitted to Swing in Swings Designed for School-age Children. The Outdoor Equipment Shall Be Free of Lead-based Paint, Sharp Corners and Shall Be Regularly Maintained in Such a Way as to Be Free of Rust And (1), Discussed Adding Equipment and Toys to Enhance Variety. Finding 591-1-1-.12(6) Requires That a Variety of Age-appropriate Toys and Play Materials Be Available, Stored on Low, Open Shelves Accessible to Children in Each Room or Assigned Area. It Was Determined Based on Observation That in Room 2-Left There Were 4 Toys on a Shelf Which Did Not Provide a Variety of Age-appropriate Toys and Play Mater (1), and 591-1-1-.25(13) Requires That Potentially Hazardous Equipment, Materials and Supplies Be Stored in a Locked Area Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That in Room 1-Left, the Classroom Closet Was Unlocked and Contained Staff's Personal Items, 4 Vacuums, a Broom and Mop Which Were Accessible to Children. - (1). None of the 4 findings were critical.
