Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.14(2) Requires a Staff Member Who Is Trained in CPR and First Aid to Be on the Premises and on Any Field Trip Whenever Any Child Is Present. In Addition, Staff Who Provide Direct Care to Children Must Satisfactorily Obtain Certification in First Aid and CPR by December 29, 2016 if Employed Prior to September 30, 2016 and Within 90 Days of Their Hire Date if Employed After September 30, 20 (1), 591-1-1-.19(1) Requires a Center to Provide 35 Square Feet of Usable Space per Child, Which Will Determine the Center's License Capacity. It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Center Housed 23 Children in a Space That Was Licensed for 18.
