Hygienic Measures Such As, but Not Limited To, Screened Windows and Proper Waste Disposal Procedures Shall Be Utilized to Minimize the Presence of Rodents, Flies, Roaches and Other Vermin at the Center. It Was Determined Based on Observation in Classroom C the Ceiling Light Cover Was Br (2), Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-.17(2) Requires That Personnel, to the Extent Possible, Keep Children Clean, Dry and Comfortable. It Was Determined Based on Investigative Findings on March 14, 2025, a Two-year-old Child Was Not Kept Clean, Dry, Comfortable When They Were Sent Home Wearing Wet Clothing (1), and Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-.07(4) Requires the Center to Have a Written Plan Which Outlines How Emergency Medical Services Will Be Obtained, Including Place(s) the Child Will Be Taken for Emergency Care. When a Medical Emergency Arises Involving a Child, the Center Staff Shall Seek Prompt Emergency Medical Treatment and Provide Any Certified or Licensed Emergency Medical Persons with Immedi (1).
