Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.20(4) Requires the Center to Keep Medication in a Cabinet or Container That Is Locked or Otherwise Not Accessible to the Children and to Be Stored Separate From Cleaning Chemicals, Supplies or Poisons. Medications Requiring Refrigeration Shall Be Placed in a Leak-proof Container in a Refrigerator That Is Not Accessible to the Children.
