Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.17(8) Requires Staff to Wash Their Hands with Liquid Soap and Warm Running Water Upon Arrival for the Day, When Moving From One Child Care Group to Another, Upon Re-entering the Child Care Area After Outside Play, Before and After Diapering Each Child, Dispensing Medication, Applying Topical Medications, Handling and Preparing Food, Eating, Drinking, Preparing Bottles, Feeding Each Child, (1), Please Ensure That if Center the Provides Any Type of Transportation to Obtain Two (2) Hours of State-approved or State-accepted Transportation Training, Biannually, for the Director and for Each Person Responsible for or Who Participates in the Transportation of Children.
