Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.03(14) - Consultant Reviewed with the Director the Requirements for Media Activities as Follows: Requires Center Staff to Limit the Use of Entertainment Media, Such as Television, Videotaped Programs or Movies and Video or Computer Games to No More Than Two (2) Hours Daily per Child or Group (1), 591-1-1-.19(1) Requires a Center to Provide 35 Square Feet of Usable Space per Child, Which Will Determine the Center's License Capacity. It Was Determined Based on Observation That in Classroom A There Were 10 Children with a Licensed Capacity for Seven Children. (1), and 591-1-1-.25(8) Requires Protective Caps on All Unused Electrical Outlets Within Children's Reach and Requires That Electrical Outlets in Use Be Made Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That in Classroom B Cords From the Smart Screen, Computer and Lamp Were Accessible to Children in Care Without Being Secure Posing a Strangulation Hazard. (1).
