Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.25(13) Requires That Potentially Hazardous Equipment, Materials and Supplies Be Stored in a Locked Area Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That These Hazards Were Observed: Room A--teacher's Purse in an Unlocked Cabinet Room C--Advil, Teacher's Purse, Lysol, Mod Podge, and Krylon Low Odor Clear Finish in an Unlocked Cabinet (1), 591-1-1-.26(6) Requires That Playground Equipment Provide an Opportunity for the Children to Engage in a Variety of Experiences and Shall Be Age-appropriate. For Example, Toddlers Shall Not Be Permitted to Swing in Swings Designed for School-age Children. The Outdoor Equipment Shall Be Free of Lead-based Paint, Sharp Corners and Shall Be Regularly Maintained in Such a Way as to Be Free of Rust And (1), and 591-1-1-.18(7) Requires Each Center to Have a Designated Space for Storage of Food and Kitchen Items and That the Area Be Kept Clean and Free of Accumulation of Dust, Dirt, Food Particles and Grease Deposits.
