Fencing Material Shall Not Present a Hazard to Children and Shall Be Maintained So as to Prevent Children From Leaving the Playground Area by Any Means Other Than Through an Approved Acc (2), The Center Appeared Clean and Well Maintained on This Date. Finding 591-1-1-.25(13) Requires That Potentially Hazardous Equipment, Materials and Supplies Be Stored in a Locked Area Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation the Following Hazards Were Accessible to the Children: Unlocked Cabinet in 1L-Infants That Had Dawn Dish Soap Inside (1), and Complete First Aid Kits Observed in Center and on Vehicles. Finding 591-1-1-.14(1) Requires the Center Director And, at Any Given Time, at Least Fifty Percent (50%) of the Caregiver Staff to Successfully Complete a Biennial Training Program in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and a Triennial Training Program in First Aid. The First Aid Training Must Be Done by Certified or Licensed Health Care (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
