Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.12(2) Requires That All Equipment and Furniture Be Free From Hazardous Conditions Such As, but Not Limited To, Sharp Rough Edges or Toxic Paint (1), 591-1-1-.26(6) Requires That Playground Equipment Provide an Opportunity for the Children to Engage in a Variety of Experiences and Shall Be Age-appropriate. For Example, Toddlers Shall Not Be Permitted to Swing in Swings Designed for School-age Children. The Outdoor Equipment Shall Be Free of Lead-based Paint, Sharp Corners and Shall Be Regularly Maintained in Such a Way as to Be Free of Rust And (1), and 591-1-1-.15(2)(a) Requires Center Personnel to Hold and Feed Infants Less Than Six Months of Age and Older Children Who Cannot Hold Their Own Bottles or Sit Alone. Baby Bottles Shall Never Be Propped (1). None of the 4 findings were critical.

- **591-1-1-.07(5) Requires Center Staff to Not Permit Children to Wear Around Their Necks or Attach to Their Clothing Pacifiers or Other Hazardous Items. It Was Determined Based Upon Observation That an 8-month-old Infant Had a Pacifier Clipped to Their Clothing While Sleeping in a Crib Causing a Potential Strangulation Hazard in Classroom Main 1L.**
