Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-.26(6) Requires That Playground Equipment Provide an Opportunity for the Children to Engage in a Variety of Experiences and Shall Be Age-appropriate. For Example, Toddlers Shall Not Be Permitted to Swing in Swings Designed for School-age Children. The Outdoor Equipment Shall Be Free of Lead-based Paint, Sharp Corners and Shall Be Regularly Maintained in Such a Way (2), 591-1-1-.25(13) Requires That Potentially Hazardous Equipment, Materials and Supplies Be Stored in a Locked Area Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Following Hazards Were Accessible to Children in Care: Room 111: -Vinyl Gloves on Shelf by the Restroom -Aquaphor, Body Spray and Two Bottle of Lotion, and Triple Antibiotic Ointment in the Staff Desk Drawer Room (1), and 591-1-1-17(7) Requires That Children Wash Their Hands with Liquid Soap and Warm Running Water Upon Arrival for Care, When Moving From One Child Care Group to Another, Upon Re-entering the Child Care Area After Outside Play, Before and After Eating Meals and Snacks, Handling or Touching Food, Playing in Water (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
