Across 1 inspection since 2026, the issues cited most often were 290-2-3-.11(2)(a) Requires the Home to Have a Written Plan for Handling Emergencies, Including but Not Limited to Fire, Severe Weather, Loss of Electrical Power or Water, and Death, Serious Injury or Loss of a Child, a Threatening Event, or Natural Disaster Which May Occur at the Home. The Home Will Have in Place Procedures for Evacuation, Relocation, Shelter-in-place, Lock-down, Communication And (2), 290-2-3-.09(5) Requires That Children Less Than Three (3) Years of Age Shall Not Spend More Than One-half (1/2) Hour of Time Consecutively in Confining Equipment, Such as Swings, Highchairs, Jumpseats, Carriers or Walkers. Children Shall Use Such Equipment Only When They Are Awake. Such Children Shall Be Allowed Time to Play on the Floor Daily. It Was Determined Based on Observation a One-year-old (1), and 290-2-3-.08(1) Requires the Home to Have a Current and Updated Record for Each Child in Care and for a Period of One (1) Year After Each Child Leaves. Such Records Shall Include: Identifying Information (Child's Name, Birth Date, Parent's Name, Home and Business Addresses, Telephone Numbers) (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
