Across 2 inspections since 2025, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.26(8) Requires Climbing and Swinging Equipment to Have a Resilient Surface Beneath the Equipment and the Fall Zone From Such Equipment Must Be Adequately Maintained by the Center to Assure Continuing Resiliency. It Was Determined Based on Measurement There Was One Inch of Measurable Rubber Mulch Under and in the Fall Zones of the Orange Metal Climbing Structure, Six Inches Were Required.
