Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were 591-1-1-.25(13) Requires That Potentially Hazardous Equipment, Materials and Supplies Be Stored in a Locked Area Inaccessible to Children. It Was Determined Based on Observation That the Following Potential Hazards Are Accessible: Classroom A: 0There Were Phone Cords Accessible Next to the Children's Library. Classroom B: -There Was a Staff Bag in an Unlocked Closet. -There Was a Bottle of Aquaon (1), 591-1-1-.26(9) Requires the Playground to Be Kept Clean, Free From Litter and Free of Hazards, Such as but Not Limited to Rocks, Exposed Tree Roots and Exposed Sharp Edges of Concrete. It Was Determined Based on Observation That There Were Seven Active Ant Beds on the Large Playground. (1), and 591-1-1-.10(4) Requires That if Diapers Are Changed on a Diaper Changing Surface, the Surface Shall Be Smooth, Nonporous, and Equipped with a Guard or Rails to Prevent Falls. Between Each Diaper Change, the Diaper Changing Surface Shall Be Cleaned with a Disinfectant and Dried with a Single-use Disposable Towel. It Was Determined Based on Observation That Staff Did Not Sanitize the Diapering Table (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
