Dear Child Care Provider:

This letter is in regards to the compliance visit at your Registered Child Development Home B conducted on 12/05/2023. Iowa Code Chapter 237A and 441 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 110, describes specific requirements that must be met by a Registered Child Development Home. You are not a participant in the voluntary Quality Rating and Improvement System. The following areas were out of compliance at the time of the visit:

441 IAC 110.9 Files

441 IAC 110.9(1) **A provider file is maintained and shall contain the following:**

- 441 IAC 110.9(2) An individual file is maintained for each staff assistant and contains:
1. Documentation from the department confirming the record checks required under subrule 110.11(3) have been completed and authorizing or conditionally limiting the person's involvement with child care
 2. A completed Form 470-5152, Child Care Provider Physical Examination Report. The examination shall include any necessary testing for communicable diseases; a discussion of recommended vaccinations; completed no more than six months prior to approval to assist or be a household member; completed by a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, physician assistant or advanced registered nurse practitioner; and repeated at least every three years.
 3. Certification of two hours of approved training related to identification and reporting of child abuse as required by Iowa Code section 232.69 within 3 months of employment.

Findings:

Per our 12/5/2023 spot check visit, the following correction needs to be made:

441 IAC 110.9(2) An individual file is maintained for each staff assistant and contains:
A completed Form 470-5152, Child Care Provider Physical Examination Report. The examination shall include any necessary testing for communicable diseases; a discussion of recommended vaccinations; completed no more than six months prior to approval to assist or be a household member; completed by a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, physician assistant or advanced registered nurse practitioner; and repeated at least every three years.

1. Lori needs to obtain a current physician signed statement of health for assistant Abby to have on file. This needs to be completed using the State form she has a copy of and needs to be renewed every three years.

No re-check is required at Lori's operation. The above correction needs to be in place by 2/29/2024 and will be reviewed during her next visit.
