Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were Not All Outlets Had Protective Coverings and One Had Tape Over It. (1), There Was No Documentation on Premesis Indicating Current Staff Were CPR and First Aide Certified (1), and The CPR and First Aide Was Expired for Staff L.C. and P.I. and A.C. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.

- **There Was No Documentation on Premesis Indicating Current Staff Were CPR and First Aide Certified**
At least one (1) direct child care provider shall be trained in pediatric cardio
- **There Were Cleaners Under the Sink, Need to Get a Lock or Move Up High Out of Reach of Children. There Was Also Cleaners in the Living Room Area and Bathroom That Would Be Accessible to Children**
Caregiver shall keep poisonous or hazardous materials that would harm children,
- **Not All Outlets Had Protective Coverings and One Had Tape Over It.**
Direct child care providers shall keep protective coverings over exposed electri
- **The Clutter in the Upstairs Is Not in Compliance with Childcare Rules. Could Cause Hazards to Children.**
The licensee shall ensure that no conditions exist in the home or on the grounds
- **The CPR and First Aide Was Expired for Staff L.C. and P.I. and A.C.**
