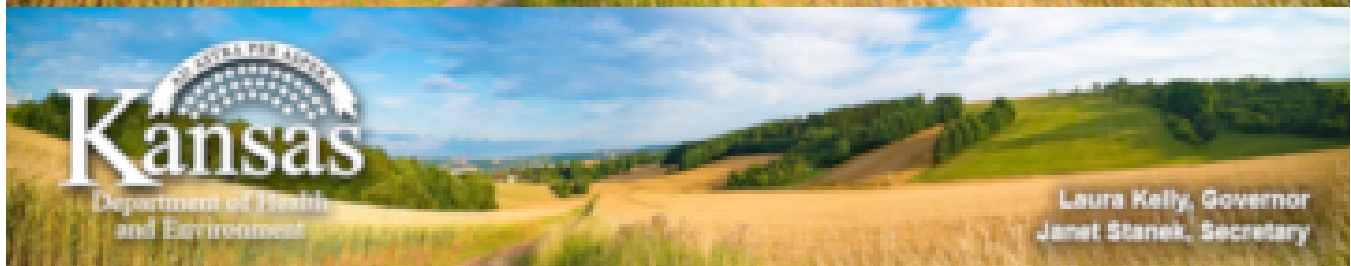

K.A.R. 28-4-127 Telephone; emergency medical treatment; reporting requirements. (b) (1) (A) Written permission of the parent or legal guardian for emergency medical treatment on a form that meets the requirements of the hospital or clinic where emergency medical care will be given; and

Description : Two out of twenty-one child files reviewed with an incomplete emergency medical release form on file.

K.A.R. 28-4-126 Health of individuals at least 16 years of age. (d) The health status form each tuberculosis test shall be recorded on forms provided by the department and shall be kept in each individual's record at the facility.

Description : One provider and one volunteer without a negative tb test on file.

K.A.R. 28-4-117 Health care requirements for children under 16 years of age and recordkeeping. (e) If an infant who has not been immunized against measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella because of the age of that child is enrolled and there are children in care who have not had measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella immunizations due to an exception, including the children of the provider, the parents of the infant at risk shall sign a statement that the parents have been informed of the risk to their child. This statement shall be in the infant's file at the facility.

Description : There is no statement on file signed by the parents of one infant stating they have been informed of an unimmunized child attending the facility.

K.A.R. 28-4-117 Health care requirements for children under 16 years of age and recordkeeping. (c) Immunizations for each child, including each child of the provider under 16 years of age shall be current as medically appropriate and shall be maintained current for protection from the diseases specified in K.A.R. 28-1-20(d). A record of each child's immunizations shall be obtained not later than 60 calendar days after the child's initial enrollment in a child care facility and shall be maintained on the child's medical record.

Description : Four out of twenty-one child files reviewed with a missing immunization record on file.

K.A.R. 28-4-117 Health care requirements for children under 16 years of age and recordkeeping. (a) (2) a medical history obtained from the parent or legal guardian. Each applicant with a temporary permit and each licensee shall review with each child's parent or legal guardian that child's medical history at least once every 12 months.

Description : Sixteen out of twenty-one child files reviewed with an incomplete medical history on file. Four out of twenty-one child files reviewed medical history is not on current form.

K.A.R. 28-4-116a Napping and sleeping. (b) (5) (G) The child may nap or sleep in sleep clothing, including sleepers and sleep sacks. Swaddling shall not be permitted.

Description : Upon arrival there is a 4-month-old napping being swaddle. Corrected at the time of survey.

K.A.R. 28-4-116 Daily care of children. (d) (1) (D) (i) All breast milk shall be labeled with the child's name and the time and date expressed.

Description : Breast milk label is missing date expressed.

K.A.R. 28-4-115 Facility. (c) (1) Has walls that are in good condition;

Description : There is a large crack on the wall in one of the playrooms accessible to children in care.

K.A.R. 28-4-114 Applicant; licensee. (h) (1) The maximum number of children in each age category, including children under 10 years of age related to the applicant with a temporary permit, the licensee, or any other provider, does not exceed the maximum number of children in each age category as specified in subsection (e), except as specified in paragraph (h)(3).

Description : One provider present with 11 children. One child under 12 months of age, 9 children 12 months to 5 years of age, and 1 child 5 to 10 years of age. Provider exceeded maximum number of children in the 12 months to 5 years of age category by 3 children. Corrected at the time of survey.
