Description : The current written safe sleep plan does not include safe sleep practices.

Description : The program director has 20 annual hours. Five of the hours are beyond the four discretionary and not KDHE approved. This gives her 15 annual hours, two of which are administrative hours.

K.A.R. 28-4-428a Education and training requirements. (e) (4) In each licensure year, each staff member counted in the staff-child ratio and each volunteer counted in the staff-child ratio shall complete 16 clock-hours of professional development training based on the staff member's or volunteer's job responsibilities and the training needs identified by the program director. Four of the 16 clock-hours shall include the subject areas specified in paragraphs (b)(2)(A), (b)(2)(C) through (J), or subsection (c).

Description : Of the 12 staff files reviewed, two do not have 16 annual hours for the 3.1.25 to 2.28.26 licensing year.

K.A.R. 28-4-423 Physical plant. (e) (1) All household supplies, cleaning supplies, dangerous chemicals and all bodily care products bearing warning labels to keep out of reach of children shall be in locked storage, except that hand sanitizers, disinfectant solutions used daily to disinfect surfaces, and diapering supplies may be kept unlocked at least five feet above the floor and out of reach of children. Soap used for hand washing may be kept unlocked and placed on the back of the counter by a bathroom or sink.

Description : In the South Room restroom, there is a bottle labeled as floor cleaner in an unlocked cabinet. Corrected at visit.

K.A.R. 28-4-421 Terms of temporary permit or license. (c) Posting the temporary permit or license and the availability of regulations. Each applicant with a temporary permit and each licensee shall post each temporary permit or license in a conspicuous place on the premises that is visible to parents. A copy of the current regulations governing child care centers and preschools shall be readily available to all staff.

Description : Current license posted shows an expiration date of 2/28/2025. Corrected at visit.
