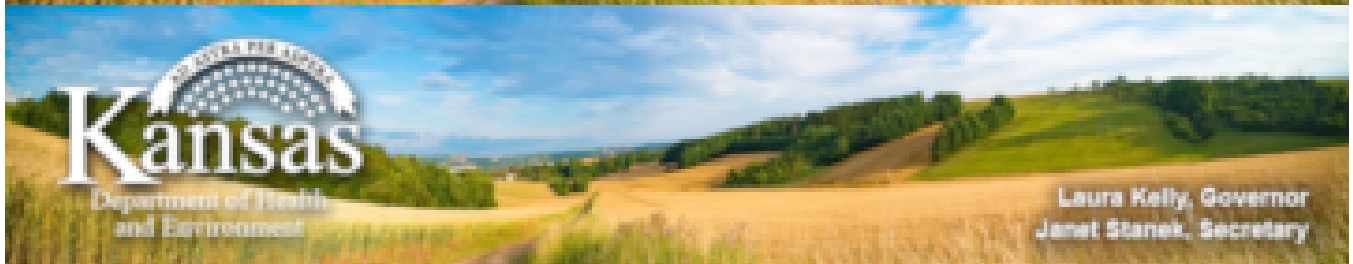

K.A.R. 28-4-436 Child care centers: napping and sleeping. (b) (1) Each applicant with a temporary permit and each licensee shall develop a written plan for safe sleep practices and implement safe sleep practices for children in care who are napping or sleeping.

**Description : There is not a written safe sleep plan for children in care.**

K.A.R. 28-4-436 Child care centers: napping and sleeping. (a) Rest period. Each child attending for more than four hours shall be encouraged to nap or rest according to their individual needs. Children who do not sleep shall be permitted to have a quiet time through the use of equipment or activities.

**Description : Children in care more than four hours do not have a nap/rest time provided.**

K.A.R. 28-4-436 Child care centers: napping and sleeping. (b) (4) Each child who is 12 months of age or older shall nap or sleep on a cot or pad. Pads shall be used only over carpet.

**Description : There are not cots or pads available for a nap/rest time for children in care.**

K.A.R. 28-4-436 Child care centers: napping and sleeping. (c) (1) Clean, individual bedding shall be provided for each child. There shall be a complete change of bedding after each five uses, immediately when wet or soiled, and always upon a change in the child utilizing the sleeping surface. Blankets shall be laundered monthly.

**Description : There is not individual bedding provided for children in care.**

K.A.R. 28-4-430 Health practices; illness and abuse; general health requirements for staff. (a) (7) Each licensee shall provide information to the parents of children in care about the benefits of annual, well-child health assessments for children under six years of age, and biennial health assessments for children six years of age and older. Each licensee shall also provide information about the importance of seeking medical advice when a child exhibits health problems. This information may be either given on a form provided by the department to the parent at the time the child is enrolled or posted in a conspicuous place, with copies of the form available to parents on request.

**Description : This information is not provided or made available. Corrected at visit.**

K.A.R. 28-4-430 Health practices; illness and abuse; general health requirements for staff. (a) (2) Each medical record shall include a medical history obtained from the parent or legal guardian. Each applicant with a temporary permit and each licensee shall review with each child's parent or legal guardian that child's medical history at least once every 12 months.

**Description : Of the 11 records reviewed for children in care, two do not have a completed medical record: medical history form.**

K.A.R. 28-4-430 Health practices; illness and abuse; general health requirements for staff. (a) (1) Each medical record shall include the results of a health assessment conducted not more than twelve months before and obtained not later than 60 calendar days after the child's initial enrollment in a child care facility. The assessment shall be conducted by a licensed physician, a physician assistant, or by a nurse approved to perform health assessments.

**Description : Of the 11 records reviewed for children in care, one does not have a**

**completed medical record: health assessment on file.**

K.A.R. 28-4-428a Education and training requirements. (b) (2) (J) medication administration training.

**Description : Of the 12 files reviewed for current staff, six do not have medication administration training on file.**

K.A.R. 28-4-132 Child care practices. (a) Each applicant, each applicant with a temporary permit, and each licensee shall ensure that supervision is provided by a person 16 years of age or older who is responsible for the health, safety, and well-being of each child in care.

**Description : In Room 155, children were preparing to go outside. The teachers were in the classroom putting their own coats on when children went out of the classroom to the hallway to retrieve their coats unsupervised.**

K.A.R. 28-4-128 Safety and emergency procedures. (a) (1) (G) procedures for continuity of operations, including backing up or retrieving health and other required records; and

**Description : The written emergency plan does not include procedures for continuity of operations, including backing up or retrieving health and other required records.**

K.A.R. 28-4-128 Safety and emergency procedures. (a) (1) (B) a designated shelter-in-place area, a designated off-premises relocation site, and evacuation routes for each area and for each site;

**Description : The written emergency plan does not include a designated off-premises relocation site or its evacuation route.**

K.A.R. 28-4-128 Safety and emergency procedures. (c) Each applicant with a temporary permit and each licensee shall maintain first-aid supplies in a first-aid kit, carrying case, box, or other container. The first-aid supplies shall include the following:

**Description : The first aid kit does not include bottled water. Corrected at visit.**
