Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:100 - Section 12. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

(9) Equipment and Toys Shall Be:

- (a) Designated by the Manufacturer as Developmentally Appropriate to the Age of Children in Care;
- (b) In Sufficient Quantity for the Number of Children in Care; And
- (c) Safe, Sound, Clean, and in Good repair.
