General: Based on Observation, There Were No Toilet Paper Dispensers Within the Preschool Bathroom. The Toilet Paper Rolls Were Stored on the Back of the Toilet Tank. This Method Of storage Promotes the Spread of Germs (1), 922 KAR 2:120. Section 13. Toys and Furnishings.
