Across 1 inspection since 2026, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements. (16) In Accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a Staff Person with Supervisory Authority Over a Child Shall Complete the Following:

(a) Six (6) Hours of Cabinet-approved Orientation Completed Within the First Three (3) Months of Employment in a Child-care Program Covering The following topics:

1. Federal Minimum Health and Safety Requirements Established in 45 C.F.R. 98.41 Related To:

a. Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases, Including Im (1), 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.
