Across 3 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements. (9) Floors, Walls, and Ceilings Shall Be Smooth, in Good Repair, and Constructed to Be Easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the Following Was found:

Early Preschool Classroom

1. A Rusty Floor Vent Near the Dramatic Play Area Was Not Fitted Flush with the floor.
2. Tape Residue Was in Multiple Areas on the Hardwood Floor Causing a Buildup of Dirt and Grime. (2), 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

(10) When a Child Is Diapered, the Child Shall:

(b) Be Placed on a Surface That is:

1. Clean;
2. Padded;
3. Free of Holes, Rips, Tears, or Other damage;
4. Nonabsorbent;
5. Easily Cleaned; and
6. Free of Any Items Not Used for Diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the Changing Pad Within the Toddler Classroom Had a Small Tear, Exposing the Interior Foam. This Renders the Pad Unable to Be Properly Sanitized (2), and 922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

(3) Rest Time Shall Occur in an Adequate Space According to the Child's Age as Follows:

(a) For an infant:

1. An Individual Non-tiered Crib That Meets Consumer Product Safety Commission Standards Established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
2. A Firm Crib Mattress in Good Repair with a Clean Tight-fitted Sheet That Shall Be Changed:
 - a. Weekly; Or
 - b. Immediately if It Is Soiled or wet;

General: Based on Observation, a Crib Mattress Did (1). None of the 10 findings were critical.
