Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements. (16) In Accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a Staff Person with Supervisory Authority Over a Child Shall Complete the Following:

(a) Six (6) Hours of Cabinet-approved Orientation Completed Within the First Three (3) Months of Employment in a Child-care Program Covering The following topics:

2. Three (3) Ceiling Tiles Contained Yellow/brown Marks and Were Bulging, Indicative of Water Damage in the Girls' Bathroom Located Across From (2), and 922 KAR 2:120. Section 8. Kitchen Requirements. (4) A Cold-storage Facility Used for Storage of Perishable Food in a Nonfrozen State Shall:
 - (a) Have an Indicating Thermometer or Other Appropriate Temperature Measuring Device;
 - (b) Be in a Safe Environment for Preservation; And
 - (c) Be Forty (40) Degrees Fahrenheit or below.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the Refrigerator in the Kitchen Did Not Contain a Temperature-measuring Device; Therefore, the Temperature of the Refrigerator Could No (1). None of the 13 findings were critical.
