Across 3 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements. (16) In Accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a Staff Person with Supervisory Authority Over a Child Shall Complete the Following:

- (a) Six (6) Hours of Cabinet-approved Orientation Completed Within the First Three (3) Months of Employment in a Child-care Program;
- (b) Nine (9) Hours of Cabinet-approved Early Care and Education Training Within the First Year of Employment in a Child Care Program, Including One and One-half (1 ½) Hours of Cabinet-a (2), 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.
- (3) A Sink Shall Be:
 - (a) Located in or Immediately Adjacent to Toilet Rooms;
 - (b) Equipped with Hot and Cold Running Water That Allows for Hand Washing;
 - (c) Equipped with Hot Water at a Minimum Temperature of Ninety (90) Degrees Fahrenheit and a Maximum of 120 Degrees Fahrenheit;
 - (d) Equipped with Liquid Soap;
 - (e) Equipped with Hand-drying Blower or Single Use Disposable Hand Drying Material;
 - (f) Equipped with an Easily Clea (1), and 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.
- (4) Each Toilet Shall:
 - (a) Be Kept in Clean Condition;
 - (b) Be Kept in Good Repair;
 - (c) Be in a Lighted Room; And
 - (d) Have Ventilation to Outside air.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the Surveyor Found the Urinal Inside the Bathroom Used by Early Head Start to Not Be in Good Repair. The Sensor Did Not Appear to Be Working; In Turn, causing the Urinal to Not Be Able to Flush Easily and completely.

Hygienic Practices (1). None of the 6 findings were critical.
