Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:100 - Section 12. The General Requirements of the Family Child-Care Home Environment.

(3) The Areas of the Home That Are Accessible to Children in Care Shall Be Free From Items Harmful to Children Including:

- (a) Cleaning Supplies, Poisons, Paints, and Insecticides;
- (b) Knives, Scissors, and Sharp Objects;
