Across 1 inspection since 2026, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care Center Staff:

General: Based on Observation, the Surveyor Found Multiple Brown Circular Stains on the Ceiling Tile Next to the Wall in the Downstairs Bathroom. Below the Middle Tile, There Were brown Lines Coming Down From the Tile to the Wall; Therefore, the Child-care Center Failed to Keep the Ceiling and Walls in Good Repair.
