Across 1 inspection since 2025, the issues cited most often were 922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

(7) The Following Shall Be Inaccessible to a Child in Care:

- (b) Matches, Cigarettes, Lighters, and Flammable Liquids; And
- (c) Personal Belongings and Medications of staff.

General: Based on Observation, Two (2) Thermoses Were Stored on a Countertop Within the Two-Year-Old Classroom and Were Accessible to the Children in Care. (1), 922 KAR 2:120. Section 13. Toys and Furnishings.

(1) All Toys and Furniture Contacted by a Child Shall Be:

- (a) Kept Clean and in Good Repair; And
- (b) Free of Peeling, Flaking, or Chalking paint.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a Cloth PJ Masks Chair Within the Two-Year-Old Classroom Was Stained with Several Dark Smudges and Dirt Streaks. (1), and 922 KAR 2:120. Section 13. Toys and Furnishings.

(2) Indoor and Outdoor Equipment Shall:

- (a) Be Clean, Safe, and in Good Repair;
- (b) Meet the Physical, Developmental Needs, and Interests of Children of Different Age Groups;
- (c) Be Free From Sharp Points or Corners, Splinters, Protruding Nails or Bolts, Loose or Rusty Parts, Hazardous Small Parts, Lead-based Paint, poisonous Material, and Flaking or Chalking Paint; And

(d) Be Designed to Guard Against Entrapment or Situations That May Cause Stran (1). None of the 3 findings were critical.
