LS Received the OCC 300 Reportable Incident Form via Email on December 22, 2025. (1), and Licensing Specialist Did Not Observe Blood Lead Testing in Four Children's Records. One Child's Record Has an Incomplete Health Inventory II Form. (1). None of the 12 findings were critical.
