Across 3 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were LS Observed 2 Instances of Children Who Need Separate Emergency Forms and to Have the Emergency Contact Addresses and Phone Numbers Filled In, and 1 Instance of a Child Missing a Lead Test Form. (2), LS Observed 1 Instance of an Uncapped Electrical Outlet in the Basement Play Area. (2), and LS Did Not Observe the Following Items in the First Aid Kit: Thermometer. Paper or Plastic Bag for Trash, and a Whistle. In Addition, the Provider Should Restock on Band Aids and Disposable Washcloths. (2). None of the 12 findings were critical.
