The Others Were Shown to Specialist on Provider's Phone, and Two Were Unable to Be Downloaded So They Will Need to Be Sent to Licensing Specialist as Soon as Possible. (4), Licensing Specialist Observed Laundry Detergent in a Closet Door That Is Accessible to Children in Care. Provider Corrected This at the Time of the Inspection. (2), and Provider Admitted That She Has Not Consistently Taken Attendance on a Regular Basis for Children in Care. Licensing Specialist Has Reminded Provider to Record Attendance Daily and Keep the Records for Each Child for Up to Two Years as Mandated by COMAR. (1). None of the 8 findings were critical.
