Infant Care Plans Should Be Updated Every 3 Months. (2), A Complaint Investigation Was Conducted on September 12, 2024. During the Inspection, a Licensing Specialist Observed Two Aides in Room 1. One of the Staff Members Had Not Been Reported to the Office of Child Care. At Around 9 Am, the Qualified Staff Member Arrived. The Issue Was Corrected During Th (2), and At Time of Inspection, Licensing Specialist Did Not Observe Part 1 or Part 2 of the Health Assessment for a Child Enrolled in Care. (1). None of the 13 findings were critical.
