Provider to Submit Photographic Evidence That All Items Have Been Placed Inaccessible to Children in Care. (2), LS Observed No Evidence of Attendance Records for the Children in Care. Provider to Submit a Memorandum of Understanding of the Regulation and the Plan of Correction Moving Forward. (1), and LS Observed 2 Emergency Cards That Were Not Complete. Provider to Submit a Written Statement Verifying That the Emergency Cards Have Been Completed and Are Accessible in the Child Files. (1). None of the 10 findings were critical.
