Across 2 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were LS Did Not Observe the Provider Wash Their Hands Before Food Preparation (2), LS Was Not Able to Observe an Emergency Preparedness Plan. (2), and LS Did Not Observe Any Appropriate Medication Forms for a Child in Care That Experiences Seizures. LS Observed Medication Inside of a Ziplock Bag, for a Child in Care. The Provider Stated This Medication Is for When the Child Has a Seizure the Medication Should Be Given to Them. (2). None of the 8 findings were critical.
