Across 3 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were At the Time of Inspection, Provider Was Missing an Individual Emergency Form for One Child in Care. Provider Was Also Missing Source of Healthcare Information for Two Children in Care. Provider Is to Have These Forms Completed and Submit Evidence to LS. (2), At the Time of Inspection, LS Could Not Observe Evidence of Fire and Emergency Drills for the Past Two Years. LS Requested That the Provider Submit Evidence of the Logs if They Are Found, or a Statement of Correction for Documenting Fire Drills Moving Forward. (1), and At the Time of Inspection, One Child in Care Was Missing Records of Immunizations. LS Requested That Provider Send Copies of the Immunization Record Once Obtained. (1). None of the 8 findings were critical.
