Across 1 inspection since 2023, the issues cited most often were Specailists Were Unable to Obtain Original, Notarized Release of Information for Three Staff Members That Allegedly Began Working at the Facility as Early as November 2022. Facility Is Asked to Send the Original Forms to the OCC. (2), Specialists Observed Five Children Missing the Received Date of the Medication by the Facility. Facility Was Able to Fill Out the Information for Three Children at the Time of the Inspection and Is Asked to Complete the Other Two Forms and Submit a Letter of Corrections. (1), and Specialists Observed an Epi-Pen and an Inhaler Used for Children in Care That Expired in March 2023. Facility Is Asked to Return the Expired Medication to the Parents and Obtain a New Prescription and Submit a Letter of Corrections Upon Completion. (1). None of the 4 findings were critical.
