Across 3 inspections since 2023, the issues cited most often were Licensing Specialist Observed Emergency Forms That Were Missing Physician Information as Well as Authorized Pick Up Person. Provider Is Reminded to Use the Most Up to Date Version of the Emergency Forms. (2), Licensing Supervisor Did Not Observe Evidence of the Provider Washing Her Hands After Wiping a Child's Runny Nose. (2), and Licensing Specialist Observed a Child Older Than 12 Months but Under 2 Years Old in a Crib. Provider Will Ask Parents for Note Granting Permission. (1). None of the 13 findings were critical.
