(2), At the Time of Inspection, 2 Children Under the Age of 2 Were Present While the Provider Is Only Approved for One Child Under the Age of Two on Their Registration. The Provider Thought That Because the Resident Child Turned 2, She Could Enroll Another Child Under the Age of 2. LS Explained the Lic (1), and At the Time of Inspection, One Child Who Was Reported to Have Started in the Beginning of the Year Did Not Have an Emergency Form, a Health Assessment, or Any Immunizations on File.
