(2), Licensing Specialist Observed Emergency Forms for Five Children in Care Had Not Been Updated Within the Last Year. Provider Is Asked to Have the Parent Review the Information, Sign and Date the Forms, and Submit a Letter of Correction Upon Completion. (1), and Licensing Specialist Observed That There Are Two Children That Require Lead Testing That Did Not Have a Doctors Note Stating It Was Not Needed. Provider Is Asked to Obtain the Missing Information and Submit a Letter of Corrections Upon Completion. (1). None of the 5 findings were critical.
