Across 4 inspections since 2024, the issues cited most often were Licensing Specialist Was Unable to Review All the Child Files Because They Are Kept in the Nurses Office. Facility Is Informed That All Children's Files Should Be Kept in the Child Care Space. (2), Licensing Specialist Reviewed Several Emergency Forms That Were Missing Information and a Few Health Inventory Forms That Were Done on the MCPS Forms. Facility Is Asked to Review All of Their Children's Files and Submit Photographic Evidence of All Emergency Forms Being Complete. (1), and Licensing Specialist Was Unable to View a Complete First Aid Kit. Facility Is Asked to Get a Large Thick Gauze Pad, Ice Packs, Paper Towels, Soap, Thermometer and Wash Cloths. Facility Is Asked to Submit Photographic Evidence Once All Items Have Been Obtained. (1). None of the 12 findings were critical.
