Provider Is Asked to Make This Area Inaccessible to Children or Ensure All Unused Outlets on the Strip Are Plugged. (2), LS Did Not Observe the Written Discipline Policy During the Inspection. Provider Is Asked to Add This Section to Their Parent Contract Referencing the Material Found in COMAR Section 13A.15.07.04. (1), and LS Observed 1 Instance of an Emergency Form Needing the Enrollment Date and Physician Contact Information. LS Also Observed 2 Instances of Children Needing Lead Test Results. (1). None of the 12 findings were critical.
