Across 1 inspection since 2024, the issues cited most often were Specialist Observed That Two Emergency Forms Were Not Maintained as They Was Missing Required Information. Provider Shall Have the Parents or Guardians Complete the Required Information and Submit a Copy of the Emergency Forms. (2), Specialist Observed That One Child Had a Lead Test at 12 Months Old but Not Again at 24 Months Old. Provider Shall Obtain Missing Lead Test or Updated Lead Test Form and Submit a copy.

Specialist Observed That at Least 5 Children Did Not Have Updated Immunization Records. Provider Shall Obtain Updat (1), and Specialist Observed No Evidence That the Children Washed Their Hands Before Eating Lunch as Required. Provider Shall Ensure That the Children Wash Their Hands at Appropriate Intervals and Submit a Letter of Corrections. (1). None of the 12 findings were critical.
